

Week 2: Hallowed Be Your Name

As you begin, read Matthew 6:10-13 and Isaiah 6:1-8 together.

Holy means “set apart.” Whether you consider yourself religious or not, there are certain people, places, and things that we “set apart” as unique or special in our world.

What do you see the world around you treating as holy?

To many, the idea of God being “set apart” gives the sense that He is separate, detached, and even indifferent to our messy realities. If you’re being honest, what does the idea of God as holy stir up in you? How does it shape your view of God?

As you read the passage from Isaiah 6, what does this encounter with God reveal about how he is holy? What does this story stir in you about your own relationship with God?

Praying to God as Holy

Jesus is what God is like (Hebrews 1:3), therefore Jesus is what holiness looks like. As you consider how Jesus modeled holiness, how does this change the way you pray to God as holy?

Everybody wants to grow. When you see the need for change in your own life, how do you pray? If holiness is ultimately Christlikeness, how would this change the way you ask God for transformation in your life?

The Spirit of God is called the Holy Spirit. He is given to make you like Jesus - to make you holy. What areas of your life need to be surrendered to the Holy Spirit’s transforming power?
