

Week 3: Your Kingdom Come

Read Mark 1:15. The word kingdom comes from the idea of the "king's domain." In other words, wherever what <u>he</u> says goes. Thinking of this what do you think Jesus is calling people to?

Read Revelation 21:1-5. This is a picture of God's heavenly kingdom. What do you think it would look like to see this become a reality on earth...now? In downtown Lexington? At your job? In your home?

Jesus' kingdom wasn't just a spiritual reality - it was a very real political statement of his Lordship. How do you see the kingdom of God Jesus shows us and the kingdoms of this world (ex. America) clashing?

Praying for God's Kingdom

Prayer is a sledgehammer to the walls between heaven and earth. Think about where you need heaven to show up. Healing? Reconciliation? Provision? Ask God for his kingdom to show up in your need.

On a larger scale, what larger events in our world - war, violence, division, etc. are weighing on your heart? Spend some time praying through these events and asking God to bring wholeness to our broken world.

"Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" isn't just a prayer. It's a call to action. We START with prayer, but we don't end there! Where are your prayers leading you in taking kingdom action in the world around you?
